## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 4 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to the Realizing Educational Achievement Can Happen (REACH)
- 3 Scholarship, so as to provide that victims of human trafficking are eligible for such
- 4 scholarship; to provide for the designation of REACH scholars; to provide for funding; to
- 5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Part 4 of Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to the Realizing Educational Achievement Can Happen (REACH) Scholarship, is
- amended by revising paragraph (3) of Code Section 20-3-497, relating to establishment of
- 11 REACH scholarship and student requirements, as follows:
- 12 "(3) Qualify for the federal free or reduced lunch program or be a victim of human
- 13 <u>trafficking</u>;"

14 SECTION 2.

15 Said part is further amended by revising Code Section 20-3-499, relating to selection of

- 16 REACH scholars, as follows:
- 17 "20-3-499.
- 18 (a) REACH participating school systems shall select each student for the program in the
- spring of the student's seventh grade year or in the fall of his or her eighth grade year, for
- 20 participation beginning in the eighth grade year. REACH participating school systems
- shall develop a rigorous application process to select REACH scholars, including but not
- 22 limited to:
- 23 (1) Identifying all students eligible for federal free or reduced price lunch by:
- 24 (A) Completing the Application for Free and Reduced Price School Meals form from 25 the Georgia Department of Education; or
- 26 (B) Direct certification by meeting one of the following criteria:
- (i) Live in a family unit receiving SNAP (Food Stamp) benefits;
- 28 (ii) Live in a family unit receiving TANF benefits;
- 29 (iii) Identify as homeless;
- 30 (iv) Identify as foster; or
- 31 (v) Identify as migrant;
- 32 (1.1) Identifying eligible students who are victims of human trafficking;
- 33 (2) Nominating qualified students to apply. Nominations can be made by counselors,
- principals, superintendents, or any individual within the REACH participating school
- 35 system who is able to identify students most in need of the REACH scholarship;
- 36 (3) Requiring nominated students to complete the REACH student application, which
- includes an academic recommendation and a community recommendation;
- 38 (4) Reviewing student packets, including the nomination form, proof of eligibility for
- federal free or reduced lunch or as a victim of human trafficking, citizenship and
- 40 residency requirements, and grade, attendance, and discipline reports; and

41 (5) Interviewing all nominated students by a student selection committee established by 42 the REACH participating school system.

- 43 (b) REACH participating school systems shall be eligible to designate <u>REACH scholars</u>
- 44 <u>each school year, the number of which shall be subject to available appropriations.</u> the
- 45 following number of REACH scholars:
- 46 (1) For school systems with five or more high schools, 12 REACH scholars; and
- 47 (2) For school systems with less than five high schools, seven REACH scholars."

48 SECTION 3.

- 49 Said part is further amended by revising subsection (b) of Code Section 20-3-499.2, relating
- 50 to funding procedures for scholarships, as follows:
- 51 "(b) Each year thereafter, the REACH participating school system will be responsible for
- 52 providing \$1,000.00 for each REACH scholar enrolled in such school system and the
- authority shall be responsible for providing \$9,000.00 for each REACH scholar enrolled
- 54 <u>in such school system.</u> a proportionate share of the scholarship. The REACH participating
- 55 school system's proportionate share shall be based on the tier designated by the Department
- of Community Affairs pursuant to Code Section 48-7-40 for the county in which the school
- 57 system is located and the population of such county, according to the United States
- decennial census of 2010 or any future such census. The term of the tier designation shall
- 59 be five years; provided, however, that in any subsequent year within the five-year
- 60 designation period in which the county of the local school system is designated with a
- 61 lower tier, a REACH participating school system may reduce its tier designation
- 62 commensurately and utilize such designation for the remainder of the five-year period.
- 63 Through Fiscal Year 2022, the 2016 Department of Community Affairs tier designation
- shall be used to define the proportionate share, as adjusted pursuant to the foregoing. The
- 65 REACH participating school system's proportionate share shall be as follows:
- 66 (1) A proportionate share of \$1,000.00 per REACH scholar for:

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- (B) Tier 2 counties with populations equal to or less than 20,000;
- 69 (2) A proportionate share of \$2,000.00 per REACH scholar for:
- 70 (A) Tier 2 counties with populations greater than 20,000; and
- 71 (B) Tier 3 counties with populations equal to or less than 20,000;
- 72 (3) A proportionate share of \$3,000.00 per REACH scholar for tier 3 counties with
- 73 populations greater than 20,000; and
- 74 (4) A proportionate share of \$4,000.00 per REACH scholar for tier 4 counties."

75 SECTION 4.

76 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
